



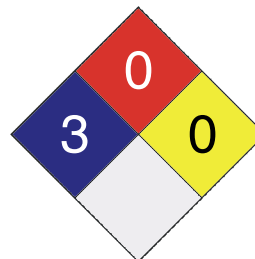

2. Hazards Identification

Emergency overview DANGER
Corrosive to aluminum. CAUSES EYE BURNS. MAY CAUSE SKIN IRRITATION.

4. First Aid Measures

First aid procedures
